One of the appeals of environmental values lies in the idea that the environment cannot be viewed as some sort of medium that is separate from human life. As John Muir (1869) wrote, When we try to pick out anything by itself, we find that it is bound fast by a thousand invisible cords that cannot be broken to everything in the universe. Shutkin (2000, p. 126-141) uses the term civic environmentalism to describe the emerging model of social and environmental activism for the 21st century. Whereas environmentalism of the past few decades has concentrated on specific media or pollutants, civic environmentalism treats overall health and quality of life in a combination of social, economic, and environmental terms. The vision is one of sustaining - and increasing - the health and quality of life of communities over time. Civic environmentalism tends to imply that communities and society in general will come to understand and appreciate the demand for resources together with the consequences of extracting resources. In concert, extractive industries will engage society using ecological thinking while offering a more holistic approach to their work and its impacts.
