The railway investment must, in a large measure, in crease in the same ratio as the length of the track, while the motor bus investment grows only in proportion to the number of vehicles employed or, what is the same thing, in proportion to the daily vehicle mileage. The importance of this feature is shown by the comparison Of the capitalization of the street railways in the Boroughs of Manhattan and The Bronx and the municipally owned and operated surface railways in London with the largest omnibus undertaking in that city.
