When the moving radius is coincident with the right-hand portion of the X axis, it is said to be in its initial position; the angle it now makes with this part of the X axis is θ . As it is revolved counter-clockwise the angle it makes with its initial position is increased until it gets back to its initial position again, when it may be said to have generated an angle of 3600; the quadrants of the circle are named I, II, III and IV, in the order in which the moving radius has passed through them (Fig. i)- Movements of the right arm in writing which follow the direction of the radii of quadrant I are movements of abduction, those of quadrant III are movements of adduction.
