In order to do so, the markets are first described in detail followed by an assessment of problems which occur in relation to livestock herding. It is clear that any improvement in this area will require a deep understanding of how these markets operate and what obstacles will impede further development. In addition, this paper will evaluate the enforceability and appropriateness of solutions suggested by the Mongolian government and by foreign donor agencies. To support our findings, we conducted a survey of Mongolian cashmere herders who were asked what daily difficulties and major obstacles they face on their livelihoods. The survey took place in October 2006 and covered 50 herding households in five aimags2, focusing on the two provinces, Bayankhongor and Uvorkhangai, that have a high number of cashmere goats.3 Herders were selected randomly from a widely...
