Owing to the cloudy state of the sky the amount of bright sunshine was below the average at all stations. Thunderstorms occurred on the 3rd, 6th, 10th, 16th, 17th, 25th to 27th, 30th, and 31st. Hail showers were frequent between the 3rd and 18th. Snow fell on the 6th, 8th, and 9th. Halos were seen on the 1st, 3rd to 5th, 13th, 15th, 16th, 20th, 23rd, 25th, and 31st. Fog occurred on the 2nd, 3rd, 5th, 10th to 14th, 16th, 17th, 21st to 24th, and 26th to 30th. June. The weather during this month was fine and dry, with a prevalence of cool winds and consequent low temperature. The mean temperature for the month, 56.3, was 10.4 below the average. The maximum temperatures occurred on the 5th, 29th, and 30th. The highest readings were 78.5 at Seathwaite and 78.3 at Scaleby...
