The European Employment Strategy (EES) was to be aligned more closely to the Lisbon goal of sustained economic growth, more and better jobs and greater social cohesion by 2010. The EES initiated a new working method at EU level, which was to become known as the Open Method of Coordination (OMC). In contrast to binding legal norms, this method is based on the voluntary cooperation of the MS and the principles of mutual learning and subsidiarity. Unlike the requirements of the Stability and Growth Pact (SGP) with elements of hard governance, the EES relies on soft governance. The competences of the MS in the range of employment and social affairs remain untouched. Following the theory of Fritz Scharpf, the...



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
