

Excerpt: . the eruptions which supplied the rhyolite and with a thickness of at least 5,000 feet are admirably exposed in the east-facing escarpment of Stein Mountain, as previously reported. To the west of Harney County, and extending to the east base of the Cascade Mountains, basalt predominates, although much eroded andesitic mountains or buttes and widely extended sheets of tuff of the same general nature are present. The old volcanic piles are represented by the Glass and Hampton buttes, and the sheets of rhyolite, and the still more abundant and more widely spread sheets of rhyolitic tuff, form the surface in the southeast part of Crook County and extend eastward into the northern part of Harney County. Basalt occupies the surface throughout nearly all of the region bordering the Great Sandy Desert and throughout the extensive tract of country in the western portion of...
