

A very simple method of distinguishing the half-groats of Henry V. from those struck by Henry VI. is this: --halfgroats of Henry V. have the mint-mark on the obverse of the coin only, and read 7VDIVTOBGCJR, very rarely JUGC: half-groats of Henry VI. read DIVTORGCimGCvm, and have the mint-mark on both sides of the coin. These coins and pieces of smaller denomination fall into place under the groats. Henry VI. Annulet Money. Type 3. Calais Geoats. C i nGCrmitt. Di kk BGCx x 7vnGL FRraa. An annulet at each side of the king s neck, the arch of the tressure on the breast never flenred. Vol. xr. N.s. x...
