It is the sole duty of Congress to legislate on national questions and at times Congress men and Senators have been greatly exercised over the encroachments of the executive departments upon the functions of the legislative bodies. Yet Congress has only too often itself stimulated departmental aggressions and bureaucratic government by engaging in the popular Washington game of passing the buck in leaving matters that should be determined in the enactment to rules and regulations to be framed by the enforcement division of one of the executive departments. Under these conditions the departments of the Government have assumed the authority to interpret the law and to frame rules and regulations that exceed oftentimes a fair construction of the enactment.
