What is Military Rank? A. Military rank is that character or quality bestowed on military persons which marks their station, and confers eligibility to exercise command or authority in the military service within the limits prescribed by law. It is divided into degrees or grades, which mark the relative positions and powers of the different classes of persons possessing it. (7) Q. What determines the order of precedence of officers in the military service? A. In each grade or subgrade, the date of commission, appointment or warrant determines the order of precedence. (9) Q. Command exercised is by virtue of what? A. By virtue of office and the special assignment of officers holding military rank, who are eligible by law to exercise command. (13) Q.
