The Oleomargarine Law continues to be well observed. But 4 cases were teminated during the past year because of violations of this law. Of these, 2 were for sale without license, one for failure to stamp as the law requires, and one for coloring and selling for butter. Twenty-five prosecutions were brought for sale of ice creams that were below standard in butter-fat. In the case of milks, 685 prosecutions were terminated. Low butter-fat gave ground for prosecutions in 624 of these cases and low solids in 528 cases. Skimming was specifically alleged in 31 cases and watering in 78 cases. The 685 cases for violations of the Milk Act represent 4,197 samples examined or about one sample in 7. This proportion is not very different from that...
