

We have convened this morning to examine the implementation of the Microloan Demonstration Program, which was created by this Committee and authorized in late 1991. This is a 5-year pilot program to test the idea of providing Federal direct loans to non-profit or community development intermediaries for the purpose of providing the smallest businesses with very modest loans and intensive management assistance. I might say not just businesses, but also individuals who want to start a business. Microloans are generally in amounts under \$10,000 but they can be in amounts up to \$25,000. This program creates jobs through new businesses for people who have no access to credit through banks or traditional lenders. It was and remains my goal...
