In 1990, following a democratization movement, the country became a parliamentary democracy under a constitutional monarch. Although this led to a process of economic restructuring and market liberalization, more than a decade of political instability and nearly seven years of increasingly dire internal security challenges have seriously hampered Nepal s economic growth and reform efforts. After several years of relatively robust growth, the economy is reported to have contracted in the fiscal year ending July 2002. Compounding the country s difficulties was the June 2001 tragedy in which 10 members of the royal family, including King Birendra, were killed in an assassination-suicide, reportedly carried out by Crown Prince Dipendra. At present, the Kathmandu government faces increasing pressure to end a 7year-old Maoist insurgency that has caused widespread violence and crippled the Nepali economy. Nearly 8,000 people reportedly have been killed in the insurgency, with some two-thirds of the deaths occurring since the Maoists broke a cease-fire agreement in November 2001. In May...
