

Head s first observations concerned the recovery of cutaneous sensitivity in patients in whom cutaneous nerves had been injured or severed. To obtain more reliable results, Head sectioned a branch of a cutaneous nerve innervating a part of his hand and forearm, and thoroughly examined the sensitivity of this part before and after the operation and during recovery. On a certain region of the area affected he found a total insensitivity when the skin was lifted away from the deeper lying tissues,...
