Since its publication in 1897 Bram Stoker s Dracula has never been out of print, and - while many monsters have come before Dracula, and many since - Stoker s vampire has taken on an iconic status. On the surface, the novel is a classic tale of horror and suspense, a battle between good and evil, light and dark, the supernatural and the natural. However, a closer examination the novel opens up an intricate portrait of Victorian anxieties, leading contemporary scholars to often view the novel as the site of a battle between the old world and the new. Edited by literary scholar Jack Lynch of Rutgers University, Newark, this volume in the Critical Insights series considers the Gothic classic from a variety of critical viewpoints. As Lynch points out in his introduction, Dracula received scant critical attention prior to the 1960s and 1970s-though much attention has been paid to the novel over the past few decades.
